



Default Pricing in Loadmaster

Charge to customers vary according to a number of factors. The key to these is the concept of Zones. Zones are used to link pricing schemes to geographic locations (normally postcodes). In effect the charge will be different when items are delivered to different places.

Zones are setup using Setup/Zones.




Here is another example which is set differently.



You can define Zones in any way that you want.


They are then linked to the Gazetteer.




Here AL1 is in Zone 1 and AB56 in Zone 2. These are just examples.

If using the first example of Zone setup then AB56 would be in Zone 3 and AL1 in Zone 2.


General Default Prices are set on the Setup/Default Prices menu but the first 10 rates are visible in Setup/Global Parameters.




Look on the Type tabs.



On this example the price is set for Type 1 (the commonest type) to Zone 1. Note only 10 Zones are shown and there are many more available. To view all Zones use Setup/Default Prices.




Note the subtle difference in these two. On the top one you charge 9 as a base charge up to 3 items. On the lower one you would charge 9 for one item, 18 for two, 27 for three etc.

These are generic rates which are used if the program can find nothing else to use.

You go up and down rates by clicking on the up and down arrows. Note that if you change a rate the you MUST SAVE it before going to another Zone.


Here is an example of another Zone.



Note that the weight charge will be added to the consignment if set. So, if you have a Parcel item charge and a weight charge then it will use both.

If you just use a weight charge then that is all that will be used.

If customers have rates different to these then the changes are made on their Account Screen.



The program will use these rates in preference to the generic Global rates if set.

Note that the up and down arrow again change Zones.

You can 'pull through' the rates from the Defaults by clicking on the REPLICATE button.

If you change the rates then you MUST SAVE changes before changing to a different Zone or they will be lost.

Always test any changes that you make to ensure accuracy. We suggest that you run periodic spot tests on the next invoice run.
